## Leadership in Attendance



**Jaron Lubin | Principal**

Jaron Lubin joined Safdie Architects in 2004, and became a Principal in 2011. He is currently serving as project designer for two projects in Singapore, Jewel Changi Airport and Sky Habitat. He has directed numerous competitions undertaken by Safdie Architects in recent years, including the Xiqu Cultural Center, West Kowloon in Hong Kong, the National Art Museum of China in Beijing, and the National Library of Israel in Jerusalem. Previously, he was integral to the competition-winning design effort for the Marina Bay Sands project, for which he relocated to Singapore to oversee design and construction, most notably as resident design architect for the SkyPark.



**Greg Reaves, AIA, LEED AP | Principal**

Greg Reaves joined Safdie Architects as a Principal in 2010. He is currently principal-in-charge for residential and mixed use projects in New York, India, China, Sri Lanka, and Singapore. He is also responsible for projects in the U.S., including the National Medal of Honor Museum in Charleston, South Carolina. Before joining the firm, Reaves was a partner at Thomas Phifer and Partners in New York, where he was responsible for more than 15 notable projects and five National AIA Honor Award recipient designs, including the

North Carolina Museum of Art expansion. Earlier, while at the offices of Richard Meier and Partners, Reaves served as a senior project designer on several projects, including the Getty Center in Los Angeles and the City Hall and Central Library in The Hague, Netherlands. He also worked at Skidmore Owings and Merrill in Chicago. Mr. Reaves is a Registered Architect, LEED AP certified professional and a member of the American Institute of Architects and Urban Land Institute.



#### **Lorenzo Mattii, AIA | Principal**

Lorenzo Mattii originally joined the practice in 1997 and has been a key design team member on some of the most significant civic commissions of the firm. Lorenzo was named the 2001 Rotch Scholar based on a two-stage competition for the prestigious architectural Rotch Traveling Fellowship. As part of his year-long course of study, he explored the relationship of architecture and nature, the importance of the public domain, and the architecture of time throughout the Middle East and Latin America. Upon returning to Safdie Architects, he then led a year-long research fellowship exploring sustainable and humanistic housing, entitled *Habitat of the Future*, which has continued to inform the design direction of the practice. Since rejoining the firm as Design Principal in 2014, Mr. Mattii is developing the design of a large-scale residential tower in New York City and an innovative housing development in the Middle East. He is a Registered Architect, NCARB-certified, and a member of the American Institute of Architects.



#### **Christa Mahar | Director of Communications**

Christa Mahar joined Safdie Architects in 2012 as the Director of Communications. An urban planner by education, Christa provides editorial support for Mr. Safdie and manages the external communications of the firm. Her projects include two recent publications, *Safdie*, a comprehensive monograph of the work of Moshe Safdie and his practice, published by Images Publishing in 2014 and *Reaching for the Sky: The Marina Bay Sands*, an in-depth look at the urban transformation of the bayfront in Singapore, published by ORO Editions in 2013. She is a member of the Society for College and University Planning and the Urban Land Institute.
